On April 25/26 1986 the world's worst nuclear power accident occurred at Chernobyl in the former USSR (now Ukraine). The next day mass evacuations of its people began. In total 135,000 people were evacuated from the area, including 50,000 from the nearby city of Pripyat. In order to reduce baggage, the residents were told that the evacuation would be temporary, lasting approximately three days. As a result, Pripyat is still complete with personal belongings that, due to radiation, can never be moved. The images in this exhibition were taken in October 2005 during a brief visit to the stricken area around Chernobyl.


